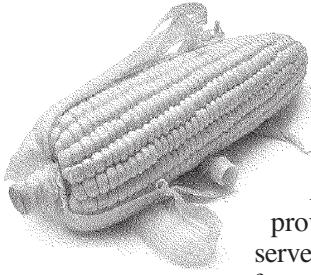

## Remembering Joe Brindisi who really knew how to make people happy!



In May, we lost another Giant who who was known and loved by all he encountered. Some of you may remember **Joe Brindisi** from his performances at the club with his band and his famous granddaughter, Cara, and his signature vibraphone. Joe, who was an RMCG member since 1996, lovingly used his talents as an officer and hard worker in several capacities to help create an atmosphere of camaraderie. This very talented humble man, with a great sense of humor, made everyone he met feel like an old friend.

We thought you would enjoy reading the following article that Joe wrote for our newsletter back in 2007 that will give you a little taste of his "Wunnerful, Wunnerful" personality.

*Hi! My name is Joe Brindisi, a long time member and former officer of the Retired Men's Club of Greendale. Currently, I am a member of the Program Committee and recently volunteered to help with the newly-formed Website Committee. I'd like to share this personal story with you.*

*For eleven years, between 1954 and 1965, I worked for the David Clark Company in Worcester. They're famous for producing Space Suits for NASA. However, when I started with them, they were manufacturing a variety of other flight garments and communications equipment for the U. S. military.*

*Some of the garments, were anti-gravity ("anti-g") suits, high altitude suits, and anti-exposure suits. The "Anti-g" suits, originally developed during the World War II era, were used to prevent fighter pilots from blacking out when pulling up from a steep and rapid dive. The pressurized high altitude suits were required by the pilots and crew of planes that were used to fly strategic and covert missions at very high altitudes ... such as the ones used by the U. S. Strategic Air Command (SAC). The anti-exposure suit, an insulated water-tight garment with a close-fitting sealed hood, protected crewmen who had to abandon ship in the middle of super-frigid waters.*

*Back to my story ... which is all about ME ... and ... ANOTHER FAMOUS PERSON!*

*The year was 1957 or 1958. At that time I was working in R&D Section at David Clark. Note: A "Security Clearance" was required due to the nature of the government work and military personnel involved. One aspect of my job was cutting out patterns for the many pieces of fabric required to manufacture the garments sized for specific subjects ... like high altitude flight pilots, as well as test pilots, etc. These pilots would come to David Clark Company to be measured for one or more of the above-mentioned garments. Then, a flight suit would subsequently be meticulously and expertly fabricated by David Clark to those exact measurements. After a month or so the pilot would return for a "fitting".*

*It was on one of these return visits that a young, fair skinned, light-haired pilot with a great smile and a sparkle in his eyes, came to Worcester via the Strategic Air Command Unit at Westover AFB in Springfield for his fitting. On this rare occasion, as luck would have it, I was asked to welcome him and "keep him occupied for a while." I met him at the reception desk and escorted him to the cafeteria because I knew that the stitchers and assemblers were still making the final touches to his "suit".*

*I was about 25, living in Worcester, working hard to support a wife and two kids. Whereas this young pilot, who could have been in his late twenties, who had the world on a string, for whom, career-wise, the "sky was the limit" (no pun intended). I remember we had an easygoing conversation about current events, his career, my job, my kids, his family, etc.*

*To make a long story short, his garment was completed, he had a successful fitting, we said our goodbyes and he went back to his base.*

### AND NOW, THE REST OF THE STORY!

*A few short years later, I was still working at the David Clark Company, but now I'm a technical writer. I was at my desk in my new office, and I looked towards my open door. Who walked by but the same young man that I helped get through his first high altitude garment fitting. He walked by the open door quickly, but in a second he returned to the portal of my office and said "Hi Joe. It's good to see a familiar face."*

*I will never forget that moment. Because that man was ... none other than... NEIL ARMSTRONG, the first man to walk on the moon!*

## **NEW Covid-19 Vaccination Policy**

The requirement for providing your trip leader a completed copy of your Covid-19 Vaccination Card showing at least one booster shot was lifted for all trips **ONLY** within the United States, Canada and Mexico, **originating after May 1, 2023**. There are still many International destinations that have special entry requirements including, but not limited to, proof of vaccination and PCR testing. 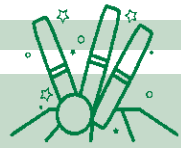
