Savannah Southern Charm with Historic Charleston

We learned about the background of the early settlers and walked through an area with many moss covered trees. In the evening, we were entertained by a Johnny Mercer impersonator and the "Ladies of the South" dinner show held in the Peacock Mansion.





On this trip, thirtyone RFCG members departed Shrewsbury to travel south by motor coach. Because of the distance involved, we stayed overnight in



Fredericksburg, VA. When we completed our journey, and arrived in Savannah, Georgia, outside temperatures and overall weather were fantastic. Our accommodations were of top quality at the Embassy Suites in both Savannah and Charleston. The 45 Bistro Restaurant provided an excellent evening meal.



Prior to Charleston we enjoyed a tour of Middletown Place, a vibrant historic site that illustrates the complex history of our nation and contains the oldest landscaped garden of azaleas, camellias, a 1000-yearold tree and cypress trees (to name a few).

Upon arrival in Charleston, we visited the downtown market prior to our boat trip to Fort Sumter. The Fort is best known for the first shot fired in the Civil War. The evening was another great meal at the Charleston Crab House restaurant. Next day's city tour was excellent. Our guide showed us the many fine homes on "rainbow row" and we drove through the "Citadel" a Military Academy. 
